Bassett Creek Watershed Management Commission Report - Clint Carlson/Shaun Kennedy/Susan Wiese

- Reported on 10 year plan
 - Top concerns: rural drainage ditches, salt liability reforms (because people can sue if someone slips on your ice)
- Reported on no-wake water quality concerns
 - ML is a shallow soft bottom lake
 - Impaired for phosphorus and Chlorophyll
 - Getting ML delisted is top priority, water lever is second priority
 - If TDL increases we have to take steps to reduce this
 - Sources of contaminants: atmosphere, point source (fertilizer), what is already in the lake as sediment. When the sediment is disturbed contaminants are released. We toss this off balance by boating and shoreline appliances (aqua thrusters), wakes are part of the problem: public safety and keep making the lake less healthy by disturbing the sediment
 - DNR has regulations, mostly for public safety

- U of M study briefly presented
- There are consequences to mis-operation of motor craft and shoreline appliances (aqua thrusters and weed rollers)
- Fertilizer ordinance discussed
 - Current ordinance requires a city permit
 - Plymouth does not have a fertilizer shoreline ordinance
 - This ordinance will be included in this process (remove permit requirement, no fertilizer to shore)
 - State has updated laws in place for fertilizer
